2020

- March 16th: Last weekend of in-person mass.
- March 20th Fish Fry was changed to drive-thru only.
- March 29th: Archbishop Kurtz suspended mass obligation and we began our live-streaming efforts.
- Friday with Fr. Scott was launched as well as a weekly email from the parish.
- May 30-31, Pentecost, we re-opened for in-person mass at 4:30 and 9:30 with social distancing protocol and mask requirements.
- No summer picnic.
- VBS virtual only
- School opened with plexi-glass everywhere!
- Christmas masses were by reservation only. 2021
- No Legacy Dinner or Summer Picnic as virus cases began to spike again.
- April: New playground ordered, trees removed and old playground closed.
- June: Parking lot resurfaced and striped.
- VBS in person with limited registrations.
- August: school resumed without partitions, but masks were still required.
- December: New playground opened after long delays in part delivery.
- Exceeding our Catholic Services Appeal goal (\$83K) two years running.

If there was a perfect storm for change, this last year would be it. Not to dwell on Covid, we cannot deny the impact it had on how we, as a parish, worshiped and celebrated community together. The last year and a half has also allowed us to look at ways to be innovative and

make procedural updates and changes.

Our goal has been to work smarter and streamline where necessary. We are challenged with being good stewards of our gifts and resources and to report to you regularly where we stand. As we have transitioned to a tuition based model, our bookkeeping methods had to change to accommodate better accounting. And since our chart of accounts hadn't been updated in a couple decades, the Archdiocese recommended that as well. With their help via audits, feedback and necessary updates, we are once again on track and will publish monthly reports.

Our Payroll Protection Plan was successfully forgiven which added \$502k to our bottom line. Along with the tremendous gift from the Mary Alice Lawler estate, Our Lady of Lourdes emerged in a healthy manner. While



tithing from school families decreased dramatically, collecting tuition payments via FACTS Mgmt has been a net positive. As a parish, we are now able to participate in the Catholic Education Foundation (CEF) financial aid process, which in the school year 2020-21 granted \$78,000 in financial aid. Along with the support of the parish and Archdiocese over \$179,000 was awarded to parish families allowing our school ministry to remain competitive in the market.

As we turn the page to a new year, we also look back at the community meetings that were held just before Covid struck. The gift from Mary Alice Lawler, which is restricted to the school, helped us to restructure some of the resulting goals. Rather than working to expand our campus footprint, we thought it more prudent to work within the footprint that we have. With the

> Archbishop's approval, we have been working with JRA Architects in a space study to determine the needs of a growing and aging school facility to determine how best to use the space and to design a floorplan that meets our needs to create a state of the art learning environment.



Within this report, my goal was not only to inform you of the health of the parish, but remind you of the many gifts that we have been bestowed, even as social challenges continue. Please refer to our website for updates and information that may not be mentioned in this recap.

As this goes to print, we've received word that our new archbishop has been appointed!



ROME — Pope Francis has tapped Bishop Shelton Fabre (Faab) as the new archbishop of Louisville, Kentucky, where he will become only the second African American archbishop in the current U.S. Catholic hierarchy.

Fabre, 58, will succeed Archbishop Joseph Kurtz who submitted his resignation to Pope Francis in August after turning 75, the traditional retirement age for Catholic bishops.

Organizations

Fundraising and events throughout the parish were greatly affected by the pandemic. Covid had a direct impact on the cancellation of fundraising activities for PTO, which budgeted \$46,250.00 potential income.

All sports were canceled as well as our Homecoming Picnic. The Booster/Athletics' typical budget is 165,000.00 with a projected net income of 19,000, again crippled.

We had planned to increase the size of our Pre-k and daycare, which we did, but additionally, federal grants, applicable to daycare programs greatly impacted in a positive way.
