




SOMETHING SPECIAL Capital Campaign

Our process began with listening sessions, then our world was turned upside down with the Covid pandemic which slowed down everything. In January 2021, we were awarded a wonderful gift from the estate of Mary Alice Lawler, a beloved teacher for many years and we were reminded that in spite of what the world hands us to deal with, our mission as a parish community does not change. So, we forged ahead by asking the Archbishop for permission to proceed, hired an architect and a consultant, conducted surveys, held meetings, formed committees...all of which brings us to where we are today – embarking on a wonderful project that will lead us into the future, just as generations before have done!

The Archbishop has approved Phase 1 for \$4.0M!

When we have the resources for Phase 1, with the reserve amount over and above that...we will pursue approval for Phase 2 for an additional \$4.0M. We have worked together as a parish for almost 75 years, being responsible stewards, or managers, of the good gifts God gives to each of us. In 2018, we started to address the needs and facility challenges we have long faced at OLOL. We hosted an "Open Forum" where all parish families were invited to reflect on our needs and join with us in making future plans for the parish and parish school.

Three main goals/questions came from that forum. The need for — Bereavement ministry: A place on campus to host meals. State of the art school: Is our school facility competitive to attract students? Security: How do we best secure our school and parking lot during school hours?

We have an exciting plan for the future of our parish. These plans include ideas that address both the needs of parish ministry and the school, which is the largest ministry of the parish.

Now is the time to conduct our capital campaign, raising the needed financial resources to update our facilities and prepare for our 75th anniversary and the next 75years of our ministry. We have much to celebrate and an important ministry to support!





PHASE 1

Enriching Our Youth with Faith, Innovation, & Security

Bringing the school office down to the first level. This addition will include an extended and more secure entrance for both students and visitors.

This relocation will allow the current office space to be renovated and used for a modern Makerspace and STEM labs.

Much needed restrooms will be added on both the 2nd and 3rd floors. While the second floor will receive most of the remodeling work, the 3rd floor will receive a refresh that includes better insulation and HVAC work.

Cafeteria kitchen will also be updated and modernized.









PHASE 2 Community, Faith, & Worship




Phase 2 includes moving the Parish offices to a beautiful new building at the front of the campus, fortifying our parish.

A multipurpose room and community center will also be apart of the building for ministry, pre-weddings, bereavement, meetings, and more.
